ITINERARIES:

- **Day 1: Delhi to Shimla (Overnight Journey)**

Activity: Begin your adventure by boarding an AC Volvo Bus for an overnight journey from Delhi to Shimla. Distance: 241 km Travel Duration: Approx. 7 hours Highlights: Enjoy the scenic drive through misty hills as you leave behind the bustling city. Overnight: Onboard the bus.

- **Day 2: Arrival in Shimla | Transfer to Chitkul**

Morning: Arrive in Shimla early morning and freshen up. Transfer: Proceed towards Chitkul, the last inhabited village near the Indo-Tibetan border. Highlights: Scenic drive along the Baspa River valley. Picturesque villages, apple orchards, and snow-capped peaks. Overnight Stay: At a homestay/guesthouse in Chitkul

- **Day 3: Chitkul to Nako**

Morning: After breakfast, head towards Nako, a serene village in the Spiti Valley. Highlights: Visit the ancient Nako Monastery. Spin the unique 500-year-old prayer wheel made of yak skin. Walk around the frozen Nako Lake. Overnight Stay: In Nako.

- **Day 4: Nako to Kaza via Tabo | Local Sightseeing in Kaza**

Morning: Drive to Kaza, the main town of Spiti Valley, stopping en route at Tabo Monastery. Highlights: Explore Tabo Monastery, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Visit Key Monastery, the largest and oldest monastery in Spiti. Admire the vibrant wall paintings and ancient architecture. Evening: Walk through Kaza's local markets. Overnight Stay: In Kaza.

- **Day 5: Sightseeing Around Kaza**

- **Day 6: Kaza to Kalpa via Dhankar**

Morning: Drive to Kalpa, stopping en route at Dhankar Monastery. Highlights: Marvel at the cliff-side architecture of Dhankar Monastery, once a royal residence. Visit Sangla Valley en route to Kalpa. Stunning views of the Kinnaur Kailash range. Overnight Stay: In Kalpa.

- **Day 7: Kalpa to Shimla | Departure to Delhi**

Morning: Begin your journey back to Shimla. Evening: Board an overnight AC Volvo Bus from Shimla to Delhi. Distance: 240 km (Kalpa to Shimla). Overnight Journey: To Delhi.

FAQS:

Q: What is the best time to visit Spiti Valley?

A: Spiti Valley is best visited during two seasons: Summer (May to September): Ideal for pleasant weather and open roads. Winter (October to March): Perfect for experiencing snow and the valley's serene beauty.

Q: Is Spiti Valley safe for solo travelers or families?

A: Yes, Spiti is generally safe for solo travelers and families. The locals are hospitable, and guided tours ensure safety. However, proper acclimatization is important due to the high altitude.

Q: How challenging is the road journey to Spiti Valley?

A: The journey involves driving on rugged mountain roads with occasional steep sections. An experienced driver and a sturdy vehicle (preferably 4x4 or SUVs) are recommended.
